### Employment Totals by Industry, Years 2004 – 2006

Employment totals over a three-year period by major industry types are compared. Special emphasis is placed upon the shifting employment levels by major industry type. All data were extracted from the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages.

### Major Findings:

- Overall employment levels have been increasing in the Jackson, MS MSA over the three-year period.
- “Trade,” “Transportation” and “Utilities” continue to employ the largest number of workers in the Jackson, Mississippi MSA
- Job growth in the “Information,” “Manufacturing”, and “Natural Resources & Mining” sectors has declined over the three-year period in the Jackson, Mississippi MSA.
- Statewide for Mississippi, employment levels have been decreasing in the “Leisure and Hospitality,” “Information,” and “Manufacturing” industry sectors.
- Statewide for Mississippi, employment levels have been increasing in the “Education and Health Services,” “Professional and Business Services” and “Trade, Transportation & Utilities” industry sectors.

### Conclusions/Policy Implications:

- Overall, employment levels have been increasing in Mississippi and the Jackson, Mississippi MSA area over the three-year period; however, this growth has not been evenly distributed. Special care needs to be exercised in deciding what job training areas, programs, and educational services are emphasized and/or funded.
